PROJECT INFORMATION

They Had Names is an award-winning digital humanities project dedicated to uncovering, preserving, and sharing information about the lives of enslaved and formerly enslaved people in coastal Georgia Liberty and Bryan Counties.

Drawing on probate records, court cases, deeds, church records, and other archival sources, the project makes these histories accessible through searchable abstracts and transcriptions, indexes, and interpretive essays.

By using digital tools to recover individual names and stories, They Had Names bridges archival research and public history, ensuring that voices often omitted from the historical record are visible to descendants, researchers, and the wider community.

Whether you're a descendant searching for family connections or a historian studying this community, They Had Names provides the tools to piece together lives that might otherwise remain hidden. Every name tells a story, and every person deserves to be remembered as an individual, not as property. The project includes abstracts or transcripts of every will, estate inventory and deed record naming enslaved people between 1786 and 1865, as well as many other types of records.

They Had Names started as a Wordpress.com blog, then transitioned in 2018 into a full website: <https://theyhadnames.net/>. It was created by Stacy Ashmore Cole, a descendant of an enslaving family of Liberty County, Georgia. Cathy Tarpley Dillon served as a dedicated transcription volunteer during 2019-2022. As of 2025, it included more than 40,000 references to named African Americans, enslaved and free.

In 2025, Stacy began assembling the data into free, downloadable books and articles to ensure its availability to future generations. That project includes this ebook.

CHANGES IN THIS VERSION

Version 1.0.1 now includes a full index for the enslaved people named in these records. Previously reference was made to a separate, downloadable spreadsheet. The link to the spreadsheet is still included in this book because it can be used to sort the data in a variety of useful ways.

The index for the enslavers has also been updated to include the date on which the appraisers were sworn (which was more often included in the court record than the actual date of the inventory, though they may often have been the same date).

INTRODUCTION

This is a review of how estate inventories were created in Liberty County and their genealogical value. It is not intended in any way to distract from the fact that pre-Emancipation Liberty County estate inventories were horrific documents, listing living people as property and assigning them a monetary value. It is difficult to read these documents today without being overwhelmed by the human suffering they represent. The only purpose of discussing and abstracting them here is to aid their descendants in finding them and remembering that “they had names.”

In the 1750s, a group several hundred European-descended South Carolina planters took advantage of Georgia’s abolishment of its laws against slavery to settle in what is now Liberty County, then St. John’s Parish in colonial Georgia on the coast. They brought with them an estimated 1000-1500 enslaved people of African descent, whom they used to construct and operate rice and other plantations.

Ironically, given that the majority of this area’s population from that time through the Civil War was comprised of enslaved people, the area was given the name Liberty County after the American Revolution because the European-descended planters had been so enthusiastic in their support of the Revolution.

Estate inventories were required for anyone who died owning property, with or without a will. Once a property-owning individual died, his or her executor (if a will naming an executor existed) or administrator (if no will) applied to the courts for letters testamentary to enable that person to secure and administer the estate. As part of this process, the court would name individuals to appraise the property and prepare the inventory. In Liberty County, at least, these were normally property-owning neighbors of the deceased, who were likely to be able to estimate the value of the deceased’s property, since it was similar to their own.

Enslaved people were considered chattel property, with “chattel” referring to “movable” property, as opposed to real estate. Estate inventories normally included only chattel property, although sometimes land would be listed.

For those attempting to find their ancestors among this enslaved population, estate inventories are invaluable records. Wills usually named only the enslaved people who were the subjects of special bequests or “favor,” such as manumission. Bills of sale, deeds of gift, and other such deed records might or might not have been recorded in the court system. Though those recorded deeds survive, most of the unrecorded ones do not. Estate inventories were part of a legal process and thus were always recorded.

Estate inventories sometimes just listed enslaved individuals’ names and “values.” Even with these minimalist documents, however, clues often stand out. Look for women’s names followed by names assigned lesser values in descending order. These may be families with children listed in age order. These can only be clues in cases where the relationship was not specified, but these clues may spark other confirming research.

The 1863 estate inventory for Bartholomew Busby, although not colonial, is an example of this. In this image, Margaret was valued at \$1000. Augustus, Abram, and George followed her in the list in descending order by value. Tenah was next at \$1000, followed by Joe, Peggy and Judy in descending order by value. Robin then followed at \$1100. From other research, it is known that Augustus, Abram and George were Margaret’s children, although this is not stated in the inventory. It is possible also that Joe, Peggy and Judy were Tenah’s children. This positioning in the estate inventory is a cue for further reseaseach.

The list of names of the enslaved people is in exactly the same order as in the original inventory. This makes it possible to look for instances of families being listed in age order.

Other estate inventories may name relationships, especially mother/child or husband/wife. (Although enslaved people were not legally permitted to marry, there were extralegal marriages recognized by the enslavers and enslaved husbands and wives would be described as such in the enslavers' probate documents.) Ages and occupations were also sometimes listed.

The estate inventories listed in this book are in date order. There are usually two dates listed: the date the appraisers took their oaths before a court official and the date the inventory was recorded in the Court of Ordinary. Only the enslaved people named in the inventory are listed, not any other "property." To find what else was listed in the inventory, see the citation at the end of each inventory. It has a link to the digitized document on FamilySearch.org. (FamilySearch.org is a genealogical website. To use it, you will need to create an account, but both the account and all the information on the website are free.)

In order to facilitate including these inventories in a database, they were created with a standardized header with field names for each piece of information commonly found within. Note especially whether an "administrator" or an "executor" were named. If an "executor" is named, the deceased left a will. The "notes" field includes any out-of-the-ordinary remarks made within the inventory.

The end of this book includes separate indexes of the enslavers and enslaved people. The indexes show their names as written in the original documents so be sure to scan the index for variant spellings. There is also a spreadsheet available via the Enslaved.org's Journal for Slavery and Data Preservation. You may find the spreadsheet here: <https://dataverse.harvard.edu/dataset.xhtml?persistentId=doi:10.7910/DVN/03HR2N>. This permanent link will give you the opportunity to download both the spreadsheet and a description of the data. You can use the spreadsheet to interrogate the data in a variety of ways.

You can also search this book when viewing it on a computer by typing Ctrl-f, which will open a search bar. Enter the name you are searching for, and press Enter. Alternative spellings have been included in the records to facilitate searching. Only the names of the deceased on whose estates the inventories were performed and the names of the enslaved people have been indexed. To find other names, use the Ctrl-f method.
